Language of training: English

Overall objectives of the mobility:

The objectives of this mobility for training are related with the operations regarding veterinary virology, namely advanced techniques involving nucleic acids, both DNA and RNA and its use both in leaning/teaching, veterinary research and diagnostic activities.

Other outcomes will be the build up of a network with greater involvement of people of both Institutions and the build up of an agreement for future learning/teaching, research mobility exchanges between both Institutions.
